

Continuing with the history of the chapters that make up Arcadia Chapter, I will focus on Harmony Chapter #11 in Willcox. Worthy Grand Patron, Dr. Edward S. Miller granted a dispensation on March 5, 1903 to organize a chapter in Willcox with twenty-one members. Half of the stations were filled by Brothers who outnumbered the Sisters. Worthy Grand Patron, Brother Miller visited the chapter on April 11, 1903 and was well pleased that Sister Bessie Grossetta, whom he had deputized earlier, had done so well in instructing the new officers in their work. For the next meeting the Worthy Grand Matron, Mrs. Mae E. Sweetnam, was a special guest and she complimented this very small Chapter on their enthusiasm, some members having traveled sixty miles from home to attend meetings. When Grand Chapter met November 30, 1903, in Tucson, Harmony Chapter U. D. was voted a Charter and given the number eleven. Harmony Chapter has been honored with Worthy Grand Matrons including Anna B. Morgan and Edith L. Cummings while Worthy Grand Patrons included Henty A Morgan and B. J. McKinney. Other Past Matrons and Patrons have served in other important capacities. This information was taken from a book entitled Four Score Years, History of the Order of the Eastern Star of Arizona by Blanche L. Whetstine, P.G.M. The book was dedicated in 1963.
